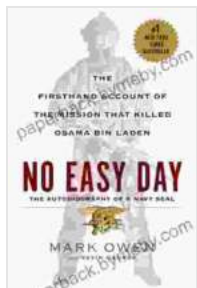

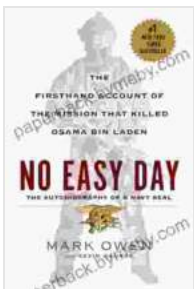
The SEAL's Story

He said that he was grateful for the opportunity to serve his country and that he was proud to be a Navy SEAL.

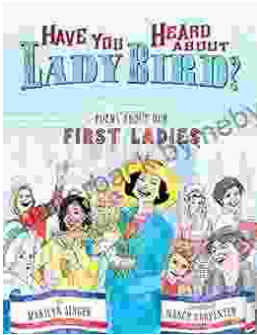

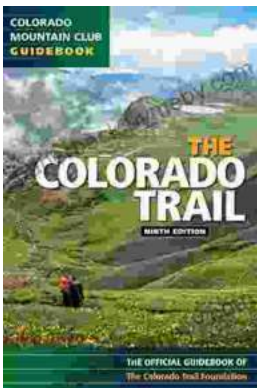
